With the Scottish Parliament having passed the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill, all areas of government (including schools, hospitals, policing and transport) will have to do everything possible to embed children's rights into everything they do.

With a strong focus on the UNCRC, there is an opportunity to contextualise how children's rights, Children's Rights Impact Assessments (CRIAs), active participation, inclusion, and child-led decisions are integrated within a professional role, and their place as a valued and meaningful part of this process.
